Greetings Community Investors!

Picture This! A group of 37 community volunteers were divided into 7 panels and tasked with an important job. They were responsible for making recommendations on the distribution of funds from the Community Impact Fund for the next grant cycle. These volunteers reviewed and scored grant applications and then listened to representatives from nonprofits explaining WHY their nonprofits should receive funding.

Picture This! After an eleven-year absence, our community members in need benefited from \$416,410 that was allocated to Washington County from the Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP). By spearheading the formation of the local board and taking on the administrative responsibilities, the United Way of Washington County took the lead to ensure that these funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) were distributed to nonprofits providing shelter and food to those in need in Washington County.

Picture This! On a bitter night in January 2022, a United Way PA 2-1-1 Southwest Resource Navigator answered a 2-1-1 call from a woman who lived in Washington. She was in despair. She and her 7-year-old son were just evicted from their apartment, and she was desperate to find shelter for the night. The Resource Navigator found her a temporary place that is funded both by the Community Impact Fund and EFSP.

Through these scenarios and many others, the United Way of Washington County is fulfilling our mission – **to unite people, resources, and organizations to improve lives in Washington County.** We could not do it without the support of Community Investors like you.

In the FY 2021-22 Campaign, a total of \$240,000 was reinvested through our Community Impact Fund that focuses on 36 local programs in education, financial stability, and health. In addition, \$74,696 was raised and redistributed as directed by donor designations including those directed to specific charities through other United Ways. The remaining amount, \$95,144 was distributed to other United Ways' specific programs.

We are forever thankful for the support of our Community Investors – *our Workplace Giving Campaign Partners, our individual and corporate donors, our volunteers, our sponsors, and our brand-new partners in 2022, our Impact Circle Members.*

Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP)

The United Way of Washington County (UWWC) took the lead and administered the EFSP after an eleven-year absence in Washington County. \$416,410 in funds were distributed to local organizations to supplement and expand ongoing efforts to provide shelter, food and supportive services to people who are hungry, homeless, and in economic crisis.
